Dr. Nicole C. Lamartine is passionate about creating innovative, engaging, and diverse choral experiences to positively impact the next generation of choral musicians. As the Sorensen Director of Choral Music at the University of California, Santa Barbara, she conducts the UCSB Chamber Choir, integrates 21st century relevance into choral studies at the MM and DMA levels, and teaches conducting and voice. Prior to her appointment at UCSB, she was Professor and Director of Choral Activities at the University of Wyoming from 2008-2020. She has conducted numerous All-State and international honor choirs, and appeared with her own choirs at national and regional ACDA, NCCO, and NAfME conferences. Nicole is recognized expert on conducting Tenor-Bass choirs, and is a Past-President of Northwestern ACDA.

Mi-Young Kim is a first year DMA student in Collaborative Piano studying with Robert Koenig. She comes to Santa Barbara most recently from Austin, TX where she received her Master of Music in Piano Accompanying.

The text consists of rhythmic syllables inspired by Indian percussion.

Covid-19 Protocols

We are closely monitoring the COVID-19 situation in Santa Barbara and the surrounding areas, as well as guidelines from the American Choral Director's Association and the Centers for Disease Control.

The First United Methodist Church where we rehearse, as well as the SBGMC currently requires the use of masks. There are singers masks designed to facilitate the ability to sing more easily than a standard mask, and each member will be provided with one.

Our current COVID-19 protocols are as follows:

- You must be fully vaccinated to participate.
- You must wear a mask.
- Rehearsal will run consecutively for no more than 50 minutes before a break will take place.

About us

Informal discussions about forming a new Tenor/Bass chorus for the LGBTQIA+ community started in November 2020 among Dr. Nicole Lamartine, and several community members including Sami Alsaloom, Michael Broyles-Shaw, Phill Conrad, Bob Nieder, Ben Oni-Cortes, and Seth Taylor. Planning continued through Spring 2021 and in Summer 2021, a few informal rehearsals were held to gauge interest.

We started formal weekly rehearsals on September 20, 2021. Tonight is our first full-length public concert.

The Santa Barbara Gay Men's Chorus as SBGMC Inc. was incorporated on October 24, 2021 as a Public Benefit Corporation in the State of California. We have made an application to the IRS for 501(c)3 status as a tax-exempt charitable organization; that application is still pending. We plan to apply to the California Franchise Tax Board for non-profit status in California in 2022.
